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## Why use the Community Zone?(CZ) eBooks

- CZ offers simplified workflows for managing large numbers of electronic resources
- Working to achieve this outcome sometimes requires work-arounds



We believe the CZ offers the prospect of simplified workflows for managing large numbers of electronic resources, especially eBooks  
To do this we need the processes to be simple and efficient  
We are working to achieve this outcome but have found some problems and issues that we are still working through with Ex Libris.  
When we are given workarounds by Ex Libris Support that involve substantial work at title level to resolve problems, we have to question whether continuing to work with the CZ is worth the pay-off

## PDA Management ProQuest EBL/OCLC

- Publisher records for all Purchased & Non-Purchased collections – then use OCLC MARC records for Purchased eBooks
- We are not using the CZ
  - Publisher withdraws purchased content – record disappears from CZ but we need to retain record
  - We need to distinguish the records between Purchased & Non-purchased



EBL marc records workflow

Swinburne has purchased and non-purchased EBL collections

Full marc records are not always available for purchased collections

Use OCLC Content Management System to source full marc records

Procedure involves first deleting any potential duplicates from the non-purchased collection – then adding (overlying) any existing marc records in the purchased collection

The ideal scenario in the CZ would be that full marc records would exist (when available) for Swinburne titles – the library could link directly to the appropriate purchased or non-purchased records.

Question for EXL: ALMA Roadmap “Improved management of shared electronic resources – H1 2016” – will this help?

## Linking/Adding to Community Zone (CZ)

- IEEE MIT Press eBooks –
  - Success in loading & linking to CZ initially. Problems with additions/updates/deletions SF00174728
  - Growing eBooks collection – critical to keep up to date
- IOP eBooks –
  - Success in loading & linking to CZ initially. Problems with additions/updates/deletions. Tried 'Contribute to CZ' 7/12/15 SF00153318
  - Growing eBooks collection – critical to keep up to date



We spoke about this at our Best Practice Nov 2014 meeting. We know how to link Local Collections to the CZ but our question was – what next?

We took three eBook Collections that have relatively small number and worked with ExLibris since May 2014 - the problems were with the monthly additions/updates/deletions. Alma would duplicate titles where the CZ had a think record and we imported the publisher MARC record. & there didn't seem to be a way to batch update or delete

We tried Contribute to CZ and after two weeks discovered that the collection was not there anymore and we had not received notification

As regards bibliographic records contribution to CZ by batch, Alma has no such an option, and I would like to discuss this with the product management team. I will update you in few weeks.

We are continuing to chase the vendor, but this would be very helpful if you could approach IOP and ask them to give the MARC records to us – we will be glad to update the CZ records upon signing an agreement with the vendor.



Solutions provided included working on editing/adding/deleting on a title by title level rather than at a batch/collection level

Then last week the solution provided was for me to contact IOP so that they can update the agreement to add the MARC records.
