Ex Libris Technical Seminar

- 189 libraries / 250 people participating
- 30 Ex Libris staff participating
- 50 training sessions including:
 - Ex Libris Developer Network
 - 2 day Primo Certification
 - 1 day Alma hands-on
- Most sessions were 90 mins; some were half-day; some included hands-on
- Sessions that were most benefit:
 - Primo APIs
 - Alma APIs
 - Primo Central Index: a peek under the hood



ELUNA 2015

- Hosted by University of Minnesota
- 603 participants representing 249 institutions
 - 3 APAC participants: Monash, University of Auckland, UNSW
- Ex Libris Corporate Update:
 - Alma: 470 institutions including 9 consortia; 168 live institutions; 15 countries
 - 2,180 Primo institutions
 - 68% of customer base is Alma-Primo
 - 3,487 institutions using Cloud Services
 - Subscription : Licenced services = 81% : 19%
 - 2015 focus: Expert services: Optimize; Extend; Analyze
