History

- 3 Universities in Adelaide
 - Long history of collaboration Alma, Voyager, and Dynix.
 - Joint Library store (URRSA). Contains low-use material from all 3 universities run from one service point.
 - Material transported by courier run between all 3 universities across metropolitan Adelaide.
 - Reciprocal borrowing arrangements all 3 universities allowed material to be borrowed since Dynix. Used to charge a fee between libraries based on net final transactions.
 - Demerit points way to discourage overdue items. Not without issues. Waning relevance since Alma.

History

- Dynix = Reciprocal Borrowing
- Voyager = Universal Borrowing
- Alma = Fulfillment Network
- Fulfillment networks allow greater flexibility for:
 - Walk-in loans
 - Direct requesting
 - Return anywhere in the network
 - Pick up anywhere in the network
 - A network patron card in Primo

History

- Fulfillment networks generated issues with:
 - User registration, and maintenance of user records
 - (in)ability to request from within Primo
 - Return anywhere in the network issues with tracking loans, and logistics
 - Pick up anywhere in the network logistical issues
 - A network patron card in Primo being able to see all activity across 3 institutions.

Some of these were configuration issues. Others were just how the fullfillment network seemed to operate as functionality matured. Possible dependencies on which APAC server each institution was situated.

- Are they the same in each institution?
- Do they need to be the same ?

Issues and Comments

A few issues:

- Patron lookup search must be exact match and return only one result
- Patron role expiry date edit record to change role expiry
- Expired patron pull down record again
- Varying levels of personal patron data at different institutions can configure
- Errors from invalid data e.g. symbols in patron phone numbers

Issues and Comments

The good bits:

- Once configured, importing and maintaining records is straightforward
- Patrons can see their loans on their home library account

Next steps:

- Review support model
- Continue to work together to optimise configuration and resolve issues
