- Used Fez/Fedora (Fez developed by UQ)
- Hosting and support outsourced to Catalyst IT



- Sourced records from Research Master (ERA)
- Began planning for replacement in 2017

#### The Process



- Staff/student information loads from SAP and SAMS
- Pubs records Migration sourced from:
  - Fez/Fedora and Research Master
  - Plus unique fields and OA files from Fez/Fedora and combined them
- Data cleansing/mapping took place before and after migration
- Launched Research Repository 10<sup>th</sup> Aug 2020
- Profiles/ERA reporting/grants/harvesting 2021

## **Challenges**



- ITS joined later, 5 ITS project managers
- ITS v Library requirements
- Project significantly bigger than first realised
- Project split into Part A, Part B and minimum viable product for launch
- Research Repository requirements not clearly understood by all ITS, Library project team members or ExLibris
- Learning curve for non-Alma users
- Ongoing challenge Salesforce
