



The **general** publishing profile required manual interventions to deal with file-naming conventions, and normalisation rules to meet minimum record requirements including the institution ID in the **context of the existing record update process** -- Lucy Cammell (UWA) identified these issues



#### CHEMISTRY DEPARTMENT.

The Melbourne Technical College is a good College; its courses are of sound content, the teaching is competent; its students are capable and keen; its graduates are in good standing in the professions in industry and in the trades—but there is still something vital lacking. The student body has not yet been welded into a corporate whole; it is not yet an articulate entity.

"We lack a Students' Union House, with those facilities which the students at this, the senior technical college of the State, might reasonably be expected to enjoy; facilities for meeting, for education, outside the examination curricula, for recreation, for refreshment.

"Sport should be an integral part of the student life of the college. How can a sports organisation worthy of our college be established on the basis of one afternoon per month?

"Real progress will come only when a student organisation analogous to that of a good university has been built up. Then our students will be able to put forth the effort, and exert the pressure which must produce results. The establishment of a regular college paper is one essential means in the creation of that "esprit de corps" which is the basis of unity. May be general purpose which this paper will serve, and been YOUR opportunity, which, remember, knocks only once! a are prepared to offer a double theatre ticket for the most.




# **Trove Harvester**





# What we wish we'd known

## **Suppressed MARC records**

Suppressed records publish with LDR position 6 = d

Suppressed records publish with no holdings

#### **Deleted MARC records**

If you remove a record from your set it will publish as deleted

If you delete records they will publish with deleted in the header. Trove will keep the bib record and remove your holdings information.

Best to contact the Trove if you want records deleted.

## Republish set

Republished records are treated as new records


If you re-publish records Trove will pick them up a second time






